The name of the ciity derives from two words; MIIÖln, which is a shorl form for Möllor, an old word for the mills, and the word Dal, which is the Swedish word for valley. Many narrow but high and long waierfalls in Kvarnhyn gave the neceassary power to all the watermills that together with the windmills on the hills gave hirth to the early industrialization of the region.

Rhody is a stocky geometric slab with distinctive vertical serifs in unexpected places. Its jumping-off point was the cover of a 1952 garden calendar that I found in the Mölndals Stadsmuseum outside Gothenburg, Sweden. With narrow, straight-sided forms and curves, Rhody's quirky, mechanical look is punctuated by extra-gappy inktraps as well as blocky forms of $\mathbf{f}, \mathbf{j}$, and $\mathbf{t}$.
